Tuition cost for the three-day workshop is \$700 and \$900 for the four-day. A \$200 deposit is required to hold your space. The remaining amount is due during the workshop. Please note: A cancellation fee of \$40 will be charged on cancellations received more than 30 days prior to the start of the workshop. Cancellations received 30 days or less prior to the start of the workshop will receive no refund of the deposit. Pending availability, registration is transferrable to another class if request is received 30 days prior to the start of the workshop (this is to allow us enough time to fill the empty spot).

Please reserve your spot by paying the deposit for the dates you chose on our website trentboschtools.com and email or mail your registration form.

Woodturning Workshops

Workshops designed for you: Each class has a tentative schedule, but Trent likes to work with your individual areas of interest and gear your experience around those interests. You can expect to learn various techniques for bowls and hollow forms as well as numerous ways to manipulate wood into the desired effect.

Specialties: Vessels Of Illusion, green wood turning, drying techniques for green wood, carving and surface treatments, making your own tools, how to generate new ideas from life experiences, finding your voice in this medium, as well as how and where to get started selling your work.

Why Choose This Workshop: Trent has been demonstrating and teaching woodturning for many years. His approach to teaching is very friendly and direct. The learning environment is one of patience and understanding. If you want to take your woodturning to the next level, give it a try.

Details: You will be provided with all the wood you can turn and more. A wide variety of the best equipment is available for your use. Trent currently has 7 Robust American Beauty Lathes, one for each participant to use during the workshop, as well as a demo space.

Lunch: There are three options: (1) you can bring your own lunches, (2) for \$12 per day we can provide lunch, it will come from a local vendor, or (3) a combination of the two options. Examples of lunch menu can be found on trentboschtools.com

Where: Workshops are located at Trent's personal studio in Fort Collins, Colorado.

Class Ratio: Classes have a maximum of six students, with time for lots of personal attention.

Schedule: Workshops are three or four days and are available throughout the year. Visit trentboschtools.com or call for a current schedule.

How Much: \$700.00 for the three-day workshop / \$900 for four-day workshop

TENTATIVE WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

Every day you can expect to see few short demos on techniques that you can try that day. The idea I have about hands on workshops is to really let the class take shape with what you have an interest in. Here is a sample schedule of topics we may discuss.

Day 1

- Turning open forms
- Getting comfortable with the 1/2" swept back grind gouge
- Different grinds to minimize sanding
- Wood selection (what to look for and why)
- Using Green Wood
- Drying options (Kiln, Air, and other ideas)
- How to cut the wood for best figure

Day 2

- Enclosed forms (Vessels of Illusion etc.)
- Tools for Hollowing
- Judging wall thickness (Look, Listen, and feel)
- Form (what is good form?)
- Turning pieces that will be carved on (leaving enough wood)

Day 3

- Wood Manipulation
 - Bending wood
 - Carving Wood
 - Sandblasting wood
- Surface treatments
 - Ways to achieve the desired effect in your work
 - Color, texture, etc.
- Finishing (lots of options)
- Whatever area you want to explore further
- Slides of work if applicable
- Look and discuss work created and techniques used

Other Topics (any day)

- Use of other materials in your work (metal plastic etc.)
- Making your own tools
- How to generate new ideas for your work (from life experiences or other interests etc.)
- Finding your own voice in woodturning
- How and where to get started selling your work

The whole idea is for this to be fun and educational so I am sure we will have a blast. I am very laid back and willing to do whatever you want. It will be a good time for all.

LODGING:

Wellington, CO is a small town with one hotel and is about 10 minutes away from my studio.

Fort Collins, CO is a bigger town with all types of hotels and accommodations. The northern part of Fort Collins would be the closest to my studio, however you can get from most parts of Fort Collins to my studio in 20-30 minutes.

There are also several campgrounds in the area with easy access to my studio.

Another Option: Trent's daughter, Kailee and her partner Laurent have a extra bedroom in their cool, 1918 restored farmhouse that they rent out to workshop participants for \$70/night. Room is first come first served. It is located 10 minutes from Trent's studio in the town of Wellington. Bedroom has a Queen size bed, and guests have access to the entire house, including kitchen. Kailee and Laurent are very easy going, and understand that the workshop can be a tiring experience and allow any of their guests to just relax and feel at home.
